## **Enhance Partnerships**

Partnered with a state Representative, community leaders, as well as South Valley Multipurpose Senior Center.



## Measure Impact

An informal needs assessment helped shape the program. A screening survey that assessed knowledge and behavior change was developed and employed as an evaluation method. The evaluation of the program showed marked improvement in knowledge, willingness to act, and commitment to act to protect children from sexual abuse.



## **Build Champions**

Train-the-trainer model reached 12 peersleaders.



### **Train & Educate**

Curriculums were adaptated with permission from the "Where We Live" curriculum and from Stop It Now! resources. The training program was presented in 2 sessions using discussion, video, powerpoint and childcentered homework activities. 12 peers were trained who then presented 8 workshops totaling 37 people.
