# **Strengthen Policies**

Delivered Circles of Safety for fostercare program leadership to strengthen policy, procedures and practices to promote children's sexual safety. Participants completed training with an initial action plan.



## **Educate & Train**

Conducted 2 awareness-to-action trainings, 2 prevention leadership trainings, 2 train-the-trainer trainings, 2 2-hour community-based workshops, 2 educational support booster webinars.



## **Provide Resources**

Developed several handouts: Family Rules for Safe Boundaries, Respect and Privacy; Internet Safety Guidelines and Tips; Communication Tips and Examples; Sexuality Concepts in Concrete Terms; Guiding Supervision Questions; Trainthe-trainer manual including a trainer's handbooks for the two workshops.

# Measure Impact

Conducted evaluations including pre and post training surveys to measure impact on confidence, attitudes, knowledge and behavior.
