





Demonstration Project: Working with Sexual Assault Survivors with Disabilities in Long-term Care Facilities

Washington Coalition of Sexual Assault Programs R1 2016-2017 \$50,000

Washington Coalition of Sexual Assault Programs in Olympia, WA increased capacity to serve sexual assault survivors with disabilities who reside in long-term care facilities, increased collaboration among such facilities and sexual assault advocacy programs, and documented model practices and policies.

Enhance Partnerships

Partnered with SAGE, Disabilities Rights Washington (DRW), and the Washington State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program (WALTCOP). The pilot site built relationships with 2 LTC facilities and worked on onsite advocacy at one facility.



Learning Circles

SAGE presented the project and work at the WCSAP annual conference in 2017.



Educate & Train

Disability Rights of Washington provided customized training for all program staff based on assessment findings.

What's next:

State partners continued collaborating with other funding and a new pilot site as the work is a priority for WCSAP who will share the VERA tool with other sites.

Provide Resources

The funding paid for reprinting costs for an existing resource entitled: Understanding Sexual Rights and Sexual Assault in Resident Advocacy. Copies were distributed to local advocacy programs and long-term care ombudsmen throughout WA.



Measure Impact

The project utilized VERA's Measuring C&C Assessment Tool Community assessment and incorporated feedback from a Resident Advisory Work-group with 8 residents of LTC.

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
